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Blighted/Abandoned Properties

Article VII, § 25(B)(3) to the Louisiana Constitution: (B) Redemption. (3) In any parish other than Orleans, when such property sold is vacant residential or commercial property which has been declared blighted, as defined by R.S. 33:1374(B)(1) on January 1, 2013, or abandoned, as defined by R.S. 33:4720.59(D)(2) on January 1, 2013, it shall be redeemable for eighteen months after the date of recordation of the tax sale by payment in accordance with Subparagraph (1) of this Paragraph.¹

The following Properties have been determined in court to be blighted or abandoned and are also adjudicated. They can be sold after a reduced (18) eighteen month redemption period.
